





Form_5 (Green Pallete) 2024 Acrylic on canvas 80 x 70 cm
















Perayap (The Other Nine) 2024





Ay Tjoe Christine

Ay Tjoe Christine (born 27 September 1973) is an Abstract Expressionist painter from Bandung, Indonesia. Ay Tjoe's artwork style is mostly abstract imagery, with the expressions of human emotions and flawed figurative objects by using colors that has developed from primarily muted to bright hues color. As for the use of mediums, she excels in painting and printmaking; her art features strong lines, abstracted figurative elements, and a unique brushstroke technique. Given the style of her works, she has received several international awards to recognize her contributions. Christine Ay Tjoe's important joint exhibitions took place in several countries, including China, the USA, the UK, Singapore, Taiwan, Indonesia, and Italy. Erika Ernawan (b.1986) is an artist who lives and works in Bandung. Erika took her bachelor and graduate degree on art at the Faculty of Fine Arts and Design, Bandung Institute of Technology. Within her artworks, Erika explores human body as an object. This way, she reminds us the journey of making decisions, establish relationships, and the art of knowing yourself.

To elaborate her ideas, Erika uses many kinds of mediums, including painting, photography, performance art, and installation art. In 2011, her artwork, 'Mirror Sees Me', gained an award from Bandung Contemporary Art Award. Erika has also had her solo exhibitions, the most recent one was in 2019 entitled 'Sight' held in RMIT Melbourne, Australia. She has also been actively participated in joint exhibitions, including Bandung Painting Today at Grey Gallery in 2024, 'Across The Time' at Can's Gallery, Jakarta in 2023, AIFES 2022 in Tokyo, and Artjog MMXXI in 2021.

Muhammad Fauzan (1998) was born in Bukittinggi, West Sumatra. He developed his artistic skills at the Indonesian Faculty of Arts, Yogyakarta, and graduated in 2022. His solo exhibition premiere entitled 'Merangkai: Unravelling The Imagined Realms' had been held last June. Fauzan has also been actively participated in joint exhibitions both in Indonesia and abroad, including Singapore Art Week, 'Setelah Perjumpaan' at Langgeng Art Foundation in 2024, Art Jakarta at JIEXPO Kemayoran.

Filippo Sciascia

Born in 1972, Filippo Sciascia lives in Bali, Indonesia, and Florence, Italy. He studied art in Italy and the united states, and He has had exhibitions in various venues in Southeast Asia, Europe, and America. Sciascia examines light as a primary artistic medium in his works across painting and sculpture, video and installations.

Gede Mahendra Yasa

Gede Mahendra Yasa (1967), who was born in Bali, Indonesia, is an artist who focuses exploring the thoughts behind the world of canvas and painting. He works with line, texture, and composition by magnifying details through intense ratios and presents strokes on the canvas that are often invisible yet break the sensation of the body.

Gede Mahendra Yasa studied at Sekolah Tinggi Seni Indonesia (STSI, Indonesia College of Fine Arts: now Institut Seni Indonesia Denpasar, Indonesia Institute oh The Arts Denpasar) in Bali from 1995 to 2001. Since 2000, he has participated in numerous group exhibition in Indonesia and Malaysia.

He held solo shows at Srisasanti Syndicate 'Marga Abstrak' (2023), Emmitan Fine Art Gallery in Surabaya in east Java in 2007, Richard koh Fine Art in Kuala Lumpur in Malaysia in 2008, Aryaseni Art Gallery in Singapore in 2008 and Langgeng Gallery in 2009. He won "Most Innovative YoungArtist" Award in Mapping Asia CIGE 2009 in Beijing, China. Hendra now lives and works in Denpasar.





JA Pramuhendra

J. Ariadhitya Pramuhendra (b.1984) is quickly making a name for himself as a rising contemporary artist in Indonesia. He graduated from Bandung Institute of Technology, majoring in Printmaking in 2007. He has participated in a number of group exhibitions presenting emerging Indonesian artists over the past couple of years and has caught audience attention with his dramatic self-portraits in charcoal on canvas. He dived into exploring abstract expressionist artthat expresses emotions and thoughts in various media. Lambang Hernanda

Lambang Hernanda (1992) is a young artist who was born and raised in Purworejo. He grew up close to artistic activities which shaped him into a creative person he is today. Lambang took his bachelor and graduate degree on art at Indonesian Institute of The Arts (ISI) Yogyakarta.

Lambang has also participated in various exhibitions, including Art Moments, by Equator Art Projects (2024), 'Melampaui Waktu' at Langgeng Art Foundation in 2024, 'Memoar 24/101' at Nadhatul Ulama University, Yogyakarta, 'Life' at Langgeng Art Foundation in 2023, and 'Affordable Art #2' at Kiniko Art Yogyakarta in 2022. In addition, Lambang has had his own exhibition at Langgeng Art Foundation entitled 'Menoreh' in 2024.





Nasirun

Nasirun (b.1965) mixes all works into authentic personal expressions: paintings filled with ornamentation, processed colors, flexible deformed forms, and present a mysterious atmosphere. Not only using canvas as the main material, Nasirun explores various mediums for painting. Nasirun's main principle of work is "painting", even on twodimensional objects. In such a creative process, Nasirun's works can be read from the perspective of contemporary art. He breaks through the conventional understanding of painting, but within the framework of painting. Apparently the exhibition was an important milestone for Nasirun's painting career, because subsequent exhibitions continued to occur, both solo and invitations from various exhibition organizing institutions. In 1999, a solo exhibition at the National Gallery of Indonesia entitled "Ojo Ngono", then at Nadi Gallery, at Galeri Salihara, and the exhibition "Salam Bekti" in 2009 which was dedicated to commemorating the 1000th anniversary of his mother's death; an exhibition of 1000 paintings at the Salihara Gallery, Jakarta; solo exhibition at Mizuma Gallery, Japan (2015), and various events in Asia, Europe and America. Joint exhibitions at innumerable important exhibitions, including the Bali Biennale Summit Event Exhibition (2005), Biennale Jogia IX: Neo-Nation (2007), Un[Real] at the National Gallery of Indonesia (2009), Commonsense at the National Gallery of Indonesia (2010), and dozens of other exhibitions both at home and abroad. A number of awards Mc Donald Award, and Phillip Moris Indonesia Art Awards (1997). Nasirun was also chosen by the Ministry of Education and Culture to be involved in the Maestro Together Study program, a workshop-like program with a number of selected students, to work while learning various things related to the creative process of art with Nasirun.





Ni Nyoman Sani

Nyoman Sani (b.1975). She was born in Sanur, Bali and start her art academy in ISI Denpasar and finished in 2001. Her awards: 100 Finalist Phillip Morris, Jakarta (2000) and 1st winner 13th UOB Painting of the Year Indonesia (2023). Restu loves to explore various media, especially watercolor, paper, video, fabric, installation, and multimedia. Most of her works discuss events of everyday life. Her topics focus on small narratives as well as objects that are related to the balance of human lives.

Her solo shows include "Memento: privatization room" in Vivi Yip Art Room, Jakarta in 2008, "Tantrum" at Kedai Kebun Forum, Yogyakarta in 2016 and "Subsume" at Baik Art, Los Angeles in 2017. Restu has participated in international group exhibitions which include "mnemonikos: Art of Memory" in Bangkok, Thailand in 2013 and "The roving eye" at Istanbul, Turkey in 2014. This abstraction of natural forms and phenomena gives rise to another image of nature in relation to what Yoyok feels and then it is depicted through his artworks. Yoyok Siswoyo was born in Malang, East Java and now lives in Yogyakarta. He was graduated from Indonesian Institute of The Arts (ISI) Yogyakarta. Yoyok actively participates in joint exhibitions, either with his group or by invitation.
